## **OTHER POSSIBLE STUDY TOPICS**

Following are other topics that might have been included in this thesis, but each was not chosen for one or more of the following reasons:

- The topic was not regarded as significant enough for the main emphasis of this thesis.
- The topic required too much time and study to adequately develop at this time.
- The topic would be very difficult to condense to fit into this thesis.
- The topic is covered partially by other topics and hard to separate out.
- The topic is more of a devotional theme than a theological study.

1. Cruciformity and Ambition — The Cross as a paradigm for true success and ambition.
2. Cruciformity and Emotional Wholeness — Cruciformity as a standard for emotional health and the means of healing.
3. Cruciformity and Cultural Paradigms — Contrasting cruciformity with paradigms of our culture and with others.
4. Cruciformity and Money — Christ's teaching and example of willingness to be poor but generous.
5. Cruciformity and the Problems of Aging / Handicaps — Cruciformity and the response to losses of physical and mental abilities.
6. Cruciformity and Theological Conflicts — Applying cruciformity to conflicts between Calvinism and Arminianism, to eschatological differences, etc.

11. True Freedom = Cruciformity — Jesus Demonstrated True Freedom to Love on the Cross.
12. Unity With One Another = Cruciformity — As we unite with Christ and His cruciformity we will be able to unite with other Christians committed to cruciformity.
